Coding Instructions For A Replacement RFID Reader


The Replacement RFID Reader's memory is blank or empty. In order to code your daily use FOB's Or Wristbands, you must first enroll a 'Master Code' into the Replacement RFID Reader's memory. Please follow the instructions below carefully.

Enrolling the 'Master Code'

- 1. Hold the Activation Tool or the Red Wristband next to the ID Sensor
- 2. It will sound a double beep.
- 3. To verify the new 'Master Code', wait 10-seconds and place the new Activation Tool or Red Wristband next to the ID Sensor.
- 4. If a double beep is sounded, the Replacement RFID Reader has accepted the new 'Master Code'.
- 5. The code is now embedded and can NOT be removed. The reader is now ready to enroll all of the other electronic keys assigned to the truck.

Enrolling Additional Codes

- 1. Hold the Activation Tool or Red Wristband next to the ID Sensor/Antenna
- 2. It will sound a double beep, click for 10-15 seconds and then sound a solid tone for 10-seconds. As soon as the 10-second solid tone starts, remove the Activation Tool or Red Wristband and place the Random FOB or Black Wristband next to the ID Sensor.
- 3. When the double beep sounds, remove the Random FOB or Black Wristband.
- 4. To verify the new code, wait 10-seconds and place the new Random FOB or Black Wristband next to the ID Sensor.
- 5. If a double beep sounds, the Replacement RFID Reader has accepted the new code.
- 6. Repeat steps 1 through 5 to enroll all codes that are required for the operation of the truck.



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Definitions

Activation Tool

A dual-purpose tool used to program 'Uncoded' RFID Readers installed in USPS trucks.



Black Wristband

A key with an 'unknown' code for daily use of a specific Fed Ex Ground truck.



Red Wristband

A tool used to program 'uncoded' RFID Readers installed in Fed Ex Ground trucks.



Delivery Location Fob

A 'Master' key fob coded for a specific VMF, capable of unlocking doors and activating The ignition system of all vehicles assigned to that VMF.



Random Truck Fob

A key fob with an 'unknown' code for daily use of a specific USPS truck.



ID Sensor

A round antenna mounted on the instrument panel or on the side of a truck.



RFID Reader

The modules, which receive the unique code from a Red or Black Wristband, a Delivery Location Fob, a Random Truck Fob or an Activation Tool. The signal is accepted and then resent to the ADL Hub.
